
# Cahaba Elementary School

Faculty/Staff: 55 Students: 552

- Named the 9th best elementary school in the state of Alabama by *U.S. News and World Report*
- Earned COGNIA's coveted STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) certification
- Presented its first musical production, *Annie Jr.*, of which thirty-two students participated, showcasing the creativity, enthusiasm, and teamwork of the student body.
- Hosted a Multicultural Fair featuring the food, music, history and other customs from the countries of Honduras, Guatemala, Korea, South Africa, Bolivia, Canada, Ghana, Mexico, Germany, India, Eskimo Culture, China, Argentina, and Ukraine.
- Received a prestigious ALSDE award for placing in the top 25% of all schools in Alabama on the state report card in 2021-2022. The award also included \$2,500 to be put towards building level initiatives.







# Magnolia Elementary School

Faculty/Staff: 57   Students: 391

- Named the 14th best elementary school in the state of Alabama by *U.S. News and World Report* 
- Earned COGNIA's coveted STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) certification
- Student Leadership Teams led service projects, donating 300 items to the Trussville Food Bank, donating \$1,153 for cancer research to Alabama Children's Hospital, and raising \$9,312 through the KIDS Heart Challenge to support the American Heart Association.
- Recognized 395 Leaders of the Pack students who showcased positive character traits, while also reaching academic excellence
- Partnered with leaders at Samford University and their College of Education to implement a school-wide calming corner initiative

# Paine Elementary School

Faculty/Staff: 147 Students: 1,342

- Named the 17th best elementary school in the state of Alabama by *U.S. News and World Report*.
- Earned COGNIA's coveted STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math) certification.
- Students were offered 1,000+ enrichment experiences through a 10-week EnRICH program. Offerings included Robotics, Paine Podcasts, Shark Tank, Musical Theater, Young Authors, Math Team, Student Leadership Team, Paine's Top Chef, as well as other opportunities.
- Students raised over \$77,034 in support of the American Heart Association under the direction of the Paine Elementary School Physical Education Department.
- Twenty Paine Elementary School students earned a perfect score on the Alabama Comprehensive Assessment Program (ACAP) assessment and three students scored perfect on the ACAP Literacy Exam.





# Hewitt-Trussville Middle School

Faculty/Staff: 116 Students: 1,141

- Given the designation of an A+ School of Excellence for the second consecutive year.
- Middle School Ambassadors raised \$2,000 to support water projects in the South Sudan.
- The Band Program had a record number of students selected for the Alabama All-State Band Program (9) breaking the previous school record of five. Also, twenty 8th graders were selected for the District Honor Band, honoring the best middle school band students in the Birmingham area.
- The Theater Department had 89 students participate in the performance of *The Lion King Jr.*
- The Choir program received superior ratings at the State Choral Performance Assessment, and also received the Distinguished Musicianship Award.

# Hewitt-Trussville High School

Faculty/Staff: 152 Students: 1,578

- Was named the 12th best high school by U.S. News and World Report in the state of Alabama. 
- Increased ACT Mean Composite Scores from 20.1 in 2020-2021, and 21.2 in 2021-2022, to 21.3 in 2022-2023.
- Was approved by the College Board to participate in the AP Capstone Diploma Program:
  - 517 students took 1,068 AP exams in the 2022-2023 school year
  - 74% of test takers had a qualifying score of 3 or higher on the exam with an average score of 3.2
  - In the 2023-2024 school year, 767 students are participating in AP Courses with an anticipated 1,696 exams projected. This will serve as 591 more exams this year.
- Students earned 347 College & Career Ready Credentials in 2022-2023.
- Students in work-based learning programs worked 52,513 hours for 80 different employers, earning a total of \$571,450 in compensation.
- Academies were offered in Computer Science, Business Leadership, Biomedical Sciences, Sports Medicine, Engineering, Hospitality and Culinary Arts, Electrical Construction, and Craft Training.





# Hewitt-Trussville Athletics

- 21 senior athletes in nine different sports signed National Letters of Intent to participate in athletics at the college level.
- 1,088 students competed on Hewitt-Trussville athletic teams.
- The High School Softball Team won the 2023 State Championship—its third title in the last four years.
- The High School Boys and Girls Cross Country teams competed at the 2023 State Championship. The boys finished in 4th place and the girls in 2nd place, their highest finish in program history.
- The High School Football Team advanced to the State Semifinals for the first time since 1996. Head Football Coach Josh Floyd was named the 7A Coach of the Year by the Alabama Football Coaches Association (ALFCA).
- 7th, 8th, and 9th grade Football teams went undefeated in the 2023 season with the 7th & 8th grade teams claiming their Metro Area Championships.
- High School Girls Basketball Coach Tonya Hunter won her 400th career game, leading the Huskies to an Area Championship and an appearance in the Elite 8.
- During the 2023 baseball season, Coach Mauldin won his 300th game as Coach of the HT Huskies.
- High School Softball Coach Taylor Burt won her 200th career game guiding the Huskies to a State Championship.








# Class of 2023 Graduates
