




Summer Screening

After registration, parents will receive information related to a summer screening for basic skills prior to starting kindergarten. Parents will be given dates and times to bring their child in for this screening. The information from the screening will provide data to assist in formulating class rolls.

School Hours

School begins each day at 8:00AM
School dismisses on Thursdays at 2:00PM
School dismisses Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and
Friday at 3:00PM
Students will be counted tardy

after 8:00AM.

Students may enter beginning at 7:20AM.

There will be teachers and safety pathfinders ready to

assist them.

* Regular attendance is essential for success.

Attendance

- Submit excuses to Paine Elementary Registrar within 3 days of the student returning to school.
- Doctor Excuses must be original and either brought to school by student/parent OR faxed to school from the Doctor's office.

Each student is allowed 6 Parent Notes per school year; however, parents may not use more than 3 parent notes on consecutive school days.

Typical School Day

- **Arrival**
- Reading/ELA Instruction
- **Math Instruction**
- **Social Studies Instruction**
- Science Instruction
- Specials (Art, Music, STEM Lab, Counselor, Library)
- Lunch, PE
- Recess (15 minutes daily with the exception of Thursdays)
- **Dismissal**

Kindergartners take an afternoon nap the first semester which is discontinued the second semester.

Arrival

Car riders enter from the back South entrance beginning at 7:20AM. The back carline doors close at 8:00AM, when the tardy bell rings. If students are eating breakfast, they will go to the lunchroom. If not eating breakfast, students report to the hallway near their homeroom teacher's door. Students will be seated near their classroom until the school day begins. Bus riders enter through the front entrance, walking either to breakfast or their hallway.


Alabama Numeracy Act




